

### WHAT IS THE CAM?

THE RIVER, ITS TRIBUTARIES, ITS WATERSHED, ITS LIFE A RARE & PRECIOUS CHALK STREAM AN IMAGE & AND ICON; A RESOURCE & A WASTE BIN?

### THREATS TO THE CAM

- pollution (Anglian Water)
  - sewage
  - agricultural
  - litter
- over-abstraction

(Cambridge Water, Affinity)



### RIVER POLLUTION

- In 2024 AW spilled untreated sewage into its region's rivers >43,919 times for >448,937 hours
  - one of 6 water authorities banned from paying bonuses because of poor performance
- E-Coli and Enterococci on the Cam
  - readings of E-Coli post DBA: 23/40 times
  - Enterococci, 12 times
  - industry (including decommissioned); agriculture; road runoff
    - hotspots in the MII/AII/AI4 triangle where a cocktail of c300 chemicals reduce oxygen > fish death (Watershed Investigations)





#### FLOW

- In August 2023, the flow in the Camwas 70% of the long term average
- Without effective locks, the Cam would be a trickle through the city
- Until 2000s water abstracted from the chalk aquifer was replenished.
   No longer as rainfall so diminished
- Less water and weaker flow > more pollution



### DROUGHT, HEAT & SUBMERGENCE

- Fens (and proposed reservoir) at or near sea level
- sea levels are rising faster than expected
- East Anglia the driest region in the UK, with some of the hottest temperatures
- rivers in drought/recovering drought status through most of the year

# WATER COMPANIES PROVIDE PROFIT NOT WATER/SEWAGE MANAGEMENT

- The Legend of Honey Hill
- Anglian Water Private Equity owned; CEO paid c£1.4m pa; £79-89 million paid in dividends, 2024 MEANWHILE ordered to pay £62.8m in improvements and in community compensation in July 2025; £1.42m fine in May 2025, .....
  - 2nd worst polluting water company in England,
     2025
- In total water companies paid £72.8 billion in dividends in 2024
- Owned by asset finds and pension funds (eg
   Cambridge Water owned by South Staffordshire
   Water owned by Arjun Capital)



### WATER CAN'T SUSTAIN NEW HOUSE BUILDING

- In 2022 the Environment Agency said there was not enough water for the planned development in Cambridge
- Local plan was making provision for levels of house building above the government's recommended level
- Since then, Cambridge Growth Company has been appointed by C. Government to fast track I 50,000 new homes for the Cambridge region
- Emphasis on AI, Data Centres and lab space which are huge water guzzlers



### THE MORE HOUSES, THE MORE EXPENSIVE THEY GET

- >6,000 new homes
   2017-22 in Greater
   Cambridge
- Median house price rose
   >10% (£480,000 in 2022)







### WHAT CAN WE DO?

RIVER RIGHTS LOBBY, VOTE, PROTEST, CHALLENGE, MONITOR

#### WHAT DOES FRIENDS OF THE CAM DO?

- work collaboratively with other groups (Save Honey Hill, Save Coton Orchard, River Rights Network ...)
- campaign to improve the quality of the water, reduce over abstraction and allow groundwater levels to recover
- · challenge all actions that threaten the life of the river
- educate ourselves and others about the Cam, rivers and environments
- initiate and support direct action to protect our rivers and their environments.
- river clean-ups
- declared the rights of the river in 2021, which we rededicate annually at midsummer
- We do not accept any corporate or government money, or funding from any organisation involved in greenwashing
